To Environmental Protection Agency:

"I strongly oppose your proposal to rescind the Endangerment Finding and to eliminate greenhouse gas standards for motor vehicles. By doing so, you are denying that the pollution causing climate change is your responsibility to address, even as we suffer more devastating disasters every year. While the stakes could not be higher for Americans, your administration is trying to limit the government's ability to do anything to limit the pollution that accelerates and strengthens these extreme weather events.

This decision leaves me wondering if anyone from the White House or EPA leadership has stepped outside recently to the sweltering heat waves or read a single news article on the floods and wildfires plaguing our nation.

Since 2009, the Endangerment Finding has formed the legal backbone for some of our most important climate protections — including limits on greenhouse gas emissions from cars and trucks, as well as power plants. This proposal ignores decades of scientific consensus and the reality that communities across the country are living with deadly heat, wildfires, floods, and toxic air caused by fossil fuel pollution.

Any attempt to roll back this cornerstone of climate law will delay climate action, make it harder to hold polluters accountable, and risk irreversible harm to our health, environment, and future. I urge you to maintain the Endangerment Finding and strengthen, not weaken, the EPA's responsibility to protect people from dangerous climate pollution."

Decades of progress to limit pollution that harms our health and wellbeing will be at risk of reversal if the administration moves forward with repealing this landmark determination. Please withdraw this reckless attempt to ignore science and the impacts of pollution on the communities across the country."
